
The Qian Long Emperor

"Now of the over ten thousand volumes submitted by the several provinces none has been singled out as offensive. How is it possible that among such a quantity of books bequeathed by former generations not one should contain a trace of sedition? ... It stands to reason therefore that among the rumors and gossip there must have been some defamatory of our dynasty. So it is that we must conduct at once a thorough investigation and destruction [of seditious books]; thus may subversive thought be put to an end, men's hearts rectified, and their morals improved; we should not let this matter drop.... Had there been any [such books] of a treasonable kind the commission had its orders to put them apart for destruction by fire".



The Chinese Language

Written Chinese was universally understood by any literate Chinese person until the split occurred between traditional characters (Taiwan, Hong Kong, Chinese overseas) and simplified characters (the PRC).

<u>Spoken</u> Chinese is split between Modern Standard Chinese – Mandarin - universally understood, and many local dialects such as Shanghainese and Cantonese.

The language reforms of the late 1950s brought in simplified characters and 'romanization' (*pīnyīn* 拼音). *Pīnyīn* is now an almost universal standard of romanization of pronunciation of Modern Standard Chinese.










The 'Organizational Chart' of China's Internet; MII: Ministry of Information Industry.



Internet Users by Gender 2006



1997 Regulations

No unit or individual may use the Internet to create, retrieve, or transmit the following kinds of information:

- 1. Inciting to resist or breaking the Constitution or laws or the implementation of administrative regulations;
- 2. Inciting to overthrow the government or the socialist system;
- 3. Inciting division of the country, harming national unification;
- 4. Inciting hatred or discrimination among nationalities or harming the unity of the nationalities;
- 5. Making falsehoods or distorting the truth, spreading rumors, destroying the order of society...



China's Internet Architecture and Bandwidth





Golden Bridge (Jin Qiao)	Ministry of Information Industry (MII), Jitong, State Information Centre	To build a national backbone and international network interface for transmitting data, voice, image and multimedia information. Also known as National Public Economic Information Communication Network
Golden Card (Jin Ka)	People's Bank of China (PBOC), MII, Ministry of Internal Trade (MIT), Great Wall Computer Company	To set up Smartcard-based electronic financial transaction system and information service
Golden Customs (Jin Guan)	Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation (MOFFEC), General Administration of Customs (GAC), Jitong	To establish networks to deal with foreign currency settlements, quota management systems, an electronic data interchange (EDI) and an import-export statistical database. Also known as National Foreign Economic Trade Information Network Project
Golden Sea (Jin Hai)	National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), PBOC, State Information Centre	To build a data network linking top government leaders with other institutions, organisations and offices under the direct jurisdiction of the Communist Party Central Committee
Golden Macro (Jin Hong)	China Ex-Im Bank, Ministry of Finance (MOF), State Information Centre	To develop a state economic and policy support system by setting up a database unifying industrial, tax, price, investment, resource, capital, energy, transport and communication information. Also known as National Economic Macro-Policy Technology System
Golden Tax (Jin Shui)	MOF, MII, State Administration of Taxation, Great Wall Computer Company	To make use of computerised work unit tax receipts and invoice returns; to create direct bank connections in order to improve the flow and use of funds across Asia
Golden Intelligence (Jin Zhi)	State Education Commission	To provide up-to-date, accurate information for teachers and research professionals and to improve international and local communication and co-operation.
Golden Enterprise (Jin Qi)	State Economic & Trade Commission	To design and build an integrated enterprise target (quota) and distribution system; to build a country-wide enterprise and product database
Golden Agriculture (Jin Nong)	Ministry of Agriculture	To develop an information service incorporating agricultural supervisory, calculation and forecasting system






