The **Qianlong Emperor** (born **Hongli**, September 25, 1711 – February 7, 1799) was the fifth emperor of the Manchu Qing Dynasty, and the fourth Qing emperor to rule over China. The fourth son of the Yongzheng Emperor, he reigned officially from October 18, 1735 to February 9, 1796, at which point he retired in favor of his son, the Jiaqing Emperor - a filial act in order not to reign longer than his grandfather, the illustrious Kangxi Emperor. Despite his retirement, however, he retained ultimate power until his death in 1799.

# The Qian Long Emperor

“Now of the over ten thousand volumes submitted by the several provinces none has been singled out as offensive. How is it possible that among such a quantity of books bequeathed by former generations not one should contain a trace of sedition? ... It stands to reason therefore that among the rumors and gossip there must have been some defamatory of our dynasty. So it is that we must conduct at once a thorough investigation and destruction [of seditious books]; thus may subversive thought be put to an end, men’s hearts rectified, and their morals improved; we should not let this matter drop.... Had there been any [such books] of a treasonable kind the commission had its orders to put them apart for destruction by fire”.

**Lu Xun** (Traditional Chinese: 鲁迅; Simplified Chinese: 鲁迅; pinyin: Lǔ Xùn) or **Lu Hsün** (Wade-Giles), pen name of **Zhou Shuren** (Traditional Chinese: 周樹人; Simplified Chinese: 周树人; Hanyu Pinyin: Zhōu Shùrén; Wade-Giles: Chou Shu-jen) (September 25, 1881 – October 19, 1936) is one of the major Chinese writers of the 20th century. Considered the founder of modern *baihua* (白話 *báihuà*) literature, Lu Xun was a short story writer, editor, translator, critic and essayist. He was one of the founders of the **China League of Left-Wing Writers in Shanghai**. Lu Xun's works exerted a very substantial influence after the **May Fourth Movement**.

# Internet Provision and Use in China

# The Chinese Language

**Written** Chinese was universally understood by any literate Chinese person until the split occurred between traditional characters (Taiwan, Hong Kong, Chinese overseas) and simplified characters (the PRC).

**Spoken** Chinese is split between Modern Standard Chinese – Mandarin - universally understood, and many local dialects such as Shanghainese and Cantonese.

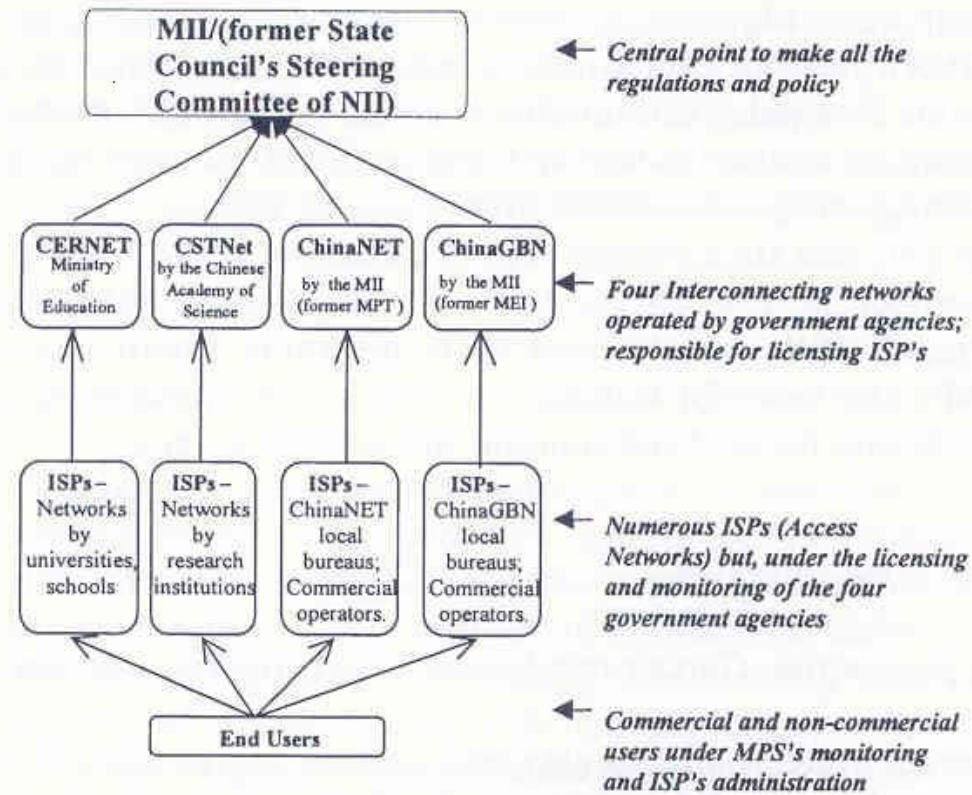
The language reforms of the late 1950s brought in simplified characters and ‘romanization’ (*pīnyīn* 拼音). *Pīnyīn* is now an almost universal standard of romanization of pronunciation of Modern Standard Chinese.

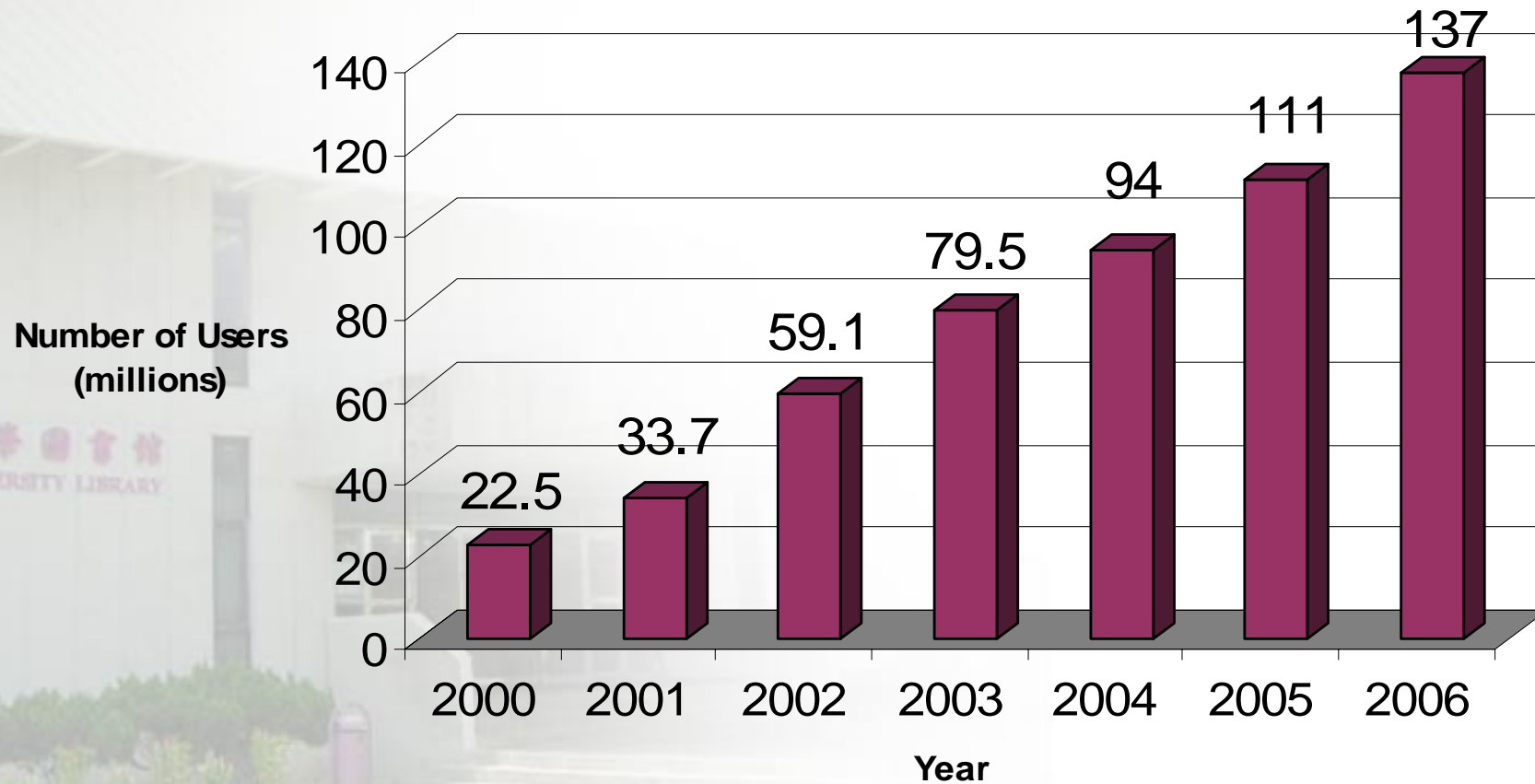




The 'Organizational Chart' of China's Internet; MII: Ministry of Information Industry.

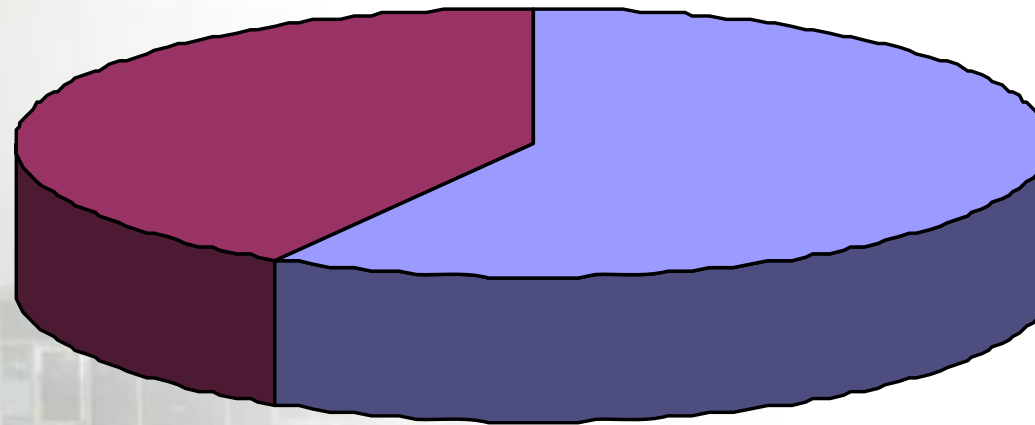

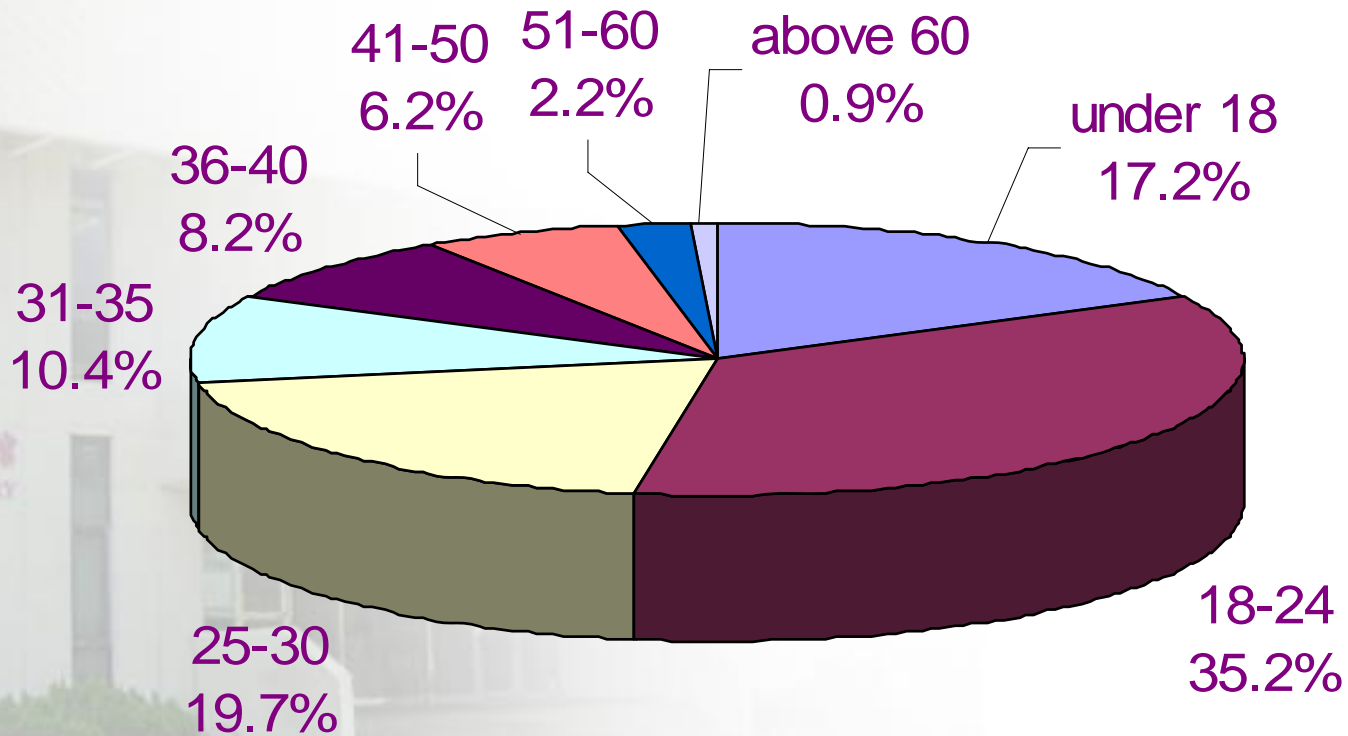


Male

4. Inciting hatred or discrimination among nationalities or harming the unity of the nationalities;
5. Making falsehoods or distorting the truth, spreading rumors, destroying the order of society...

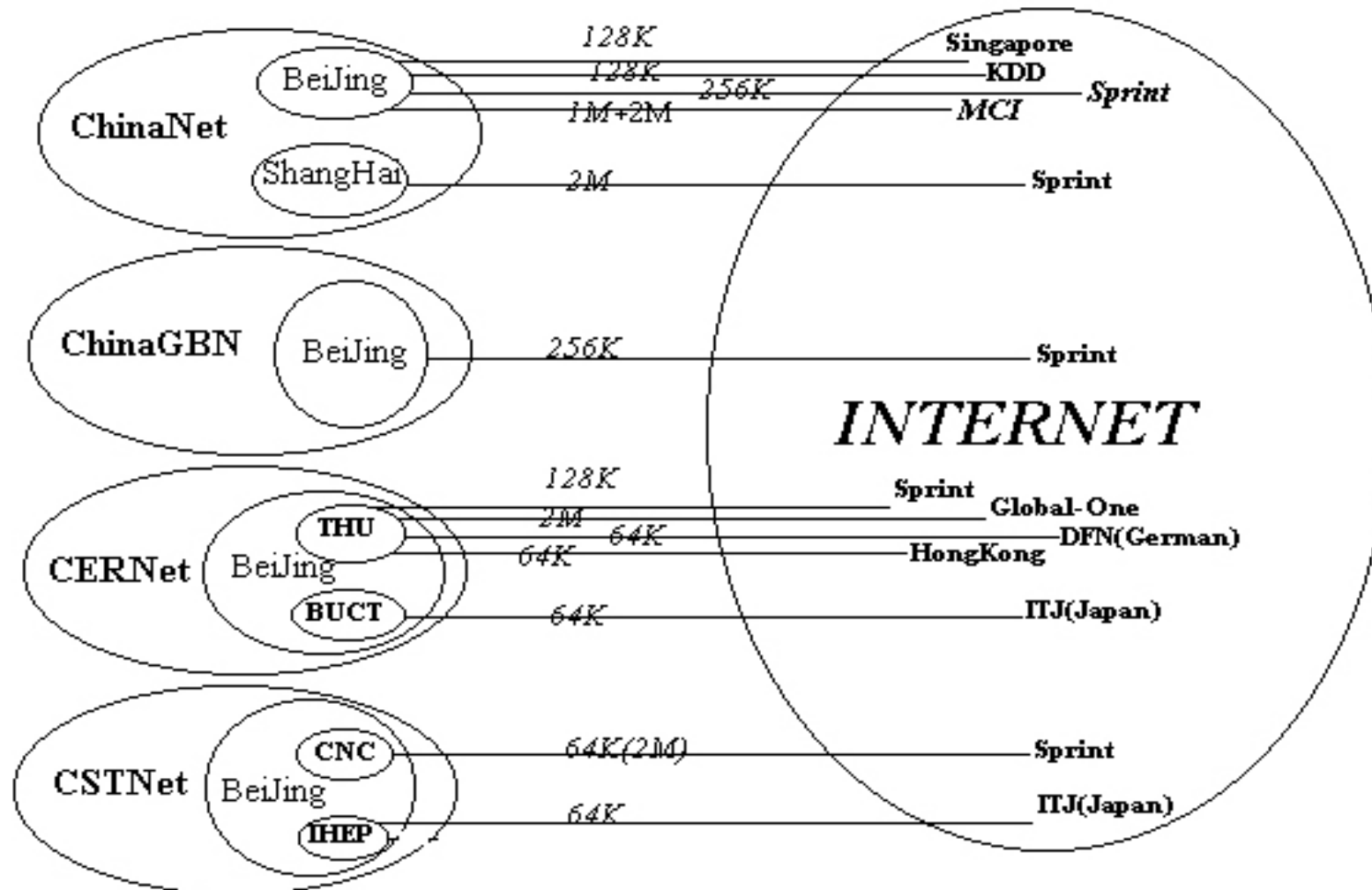

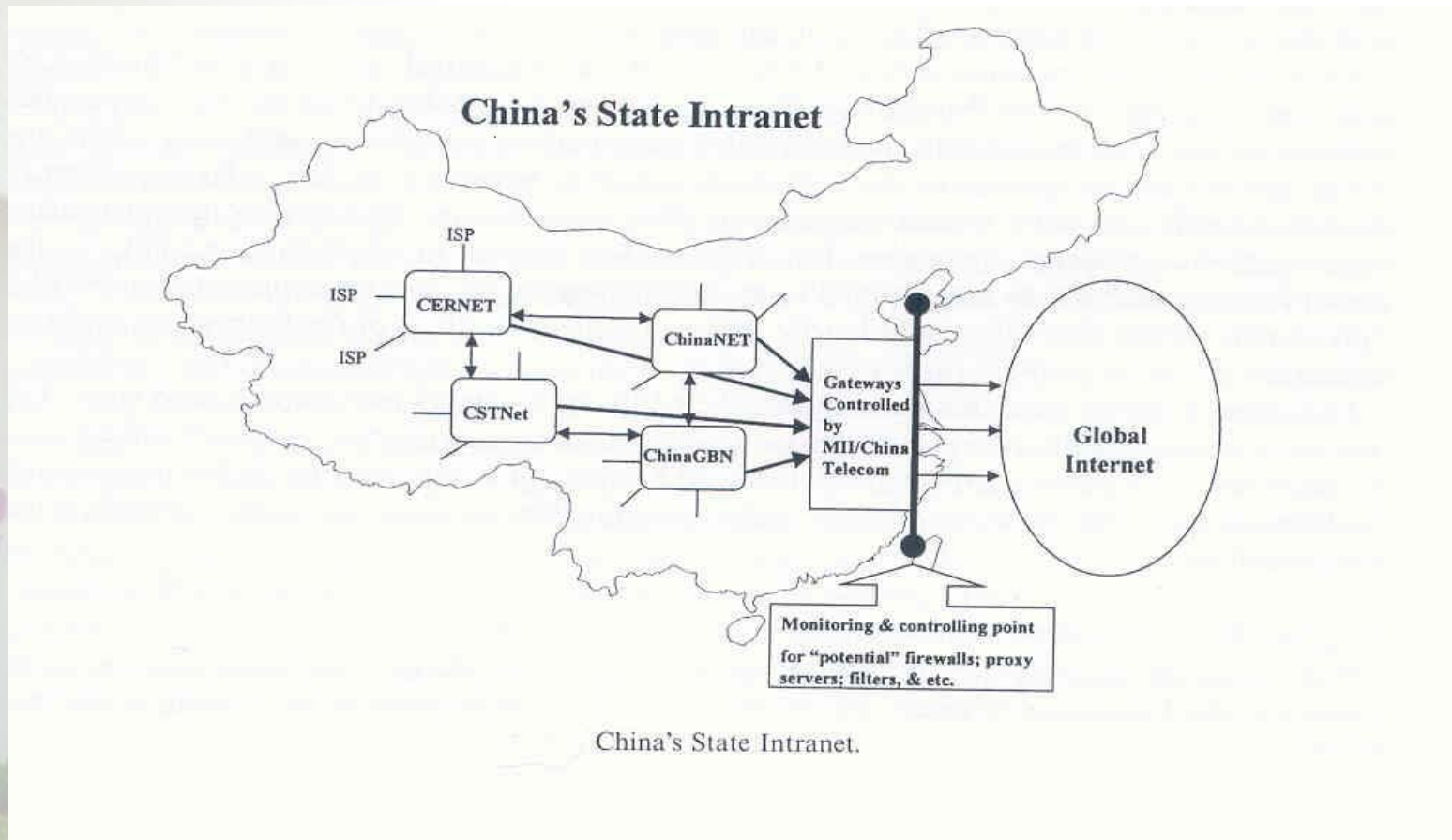


# China's Internet Architecture and Bandwidth

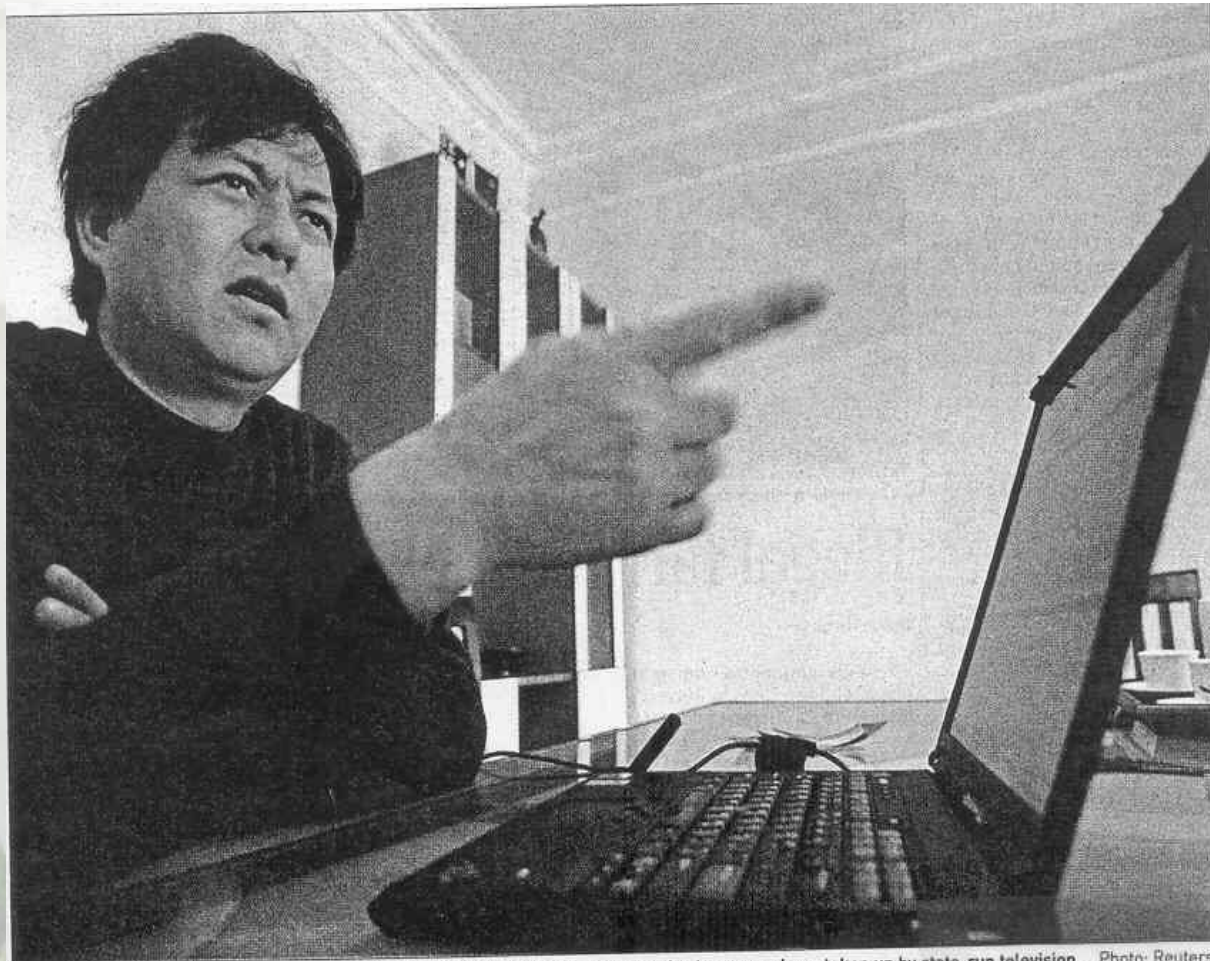

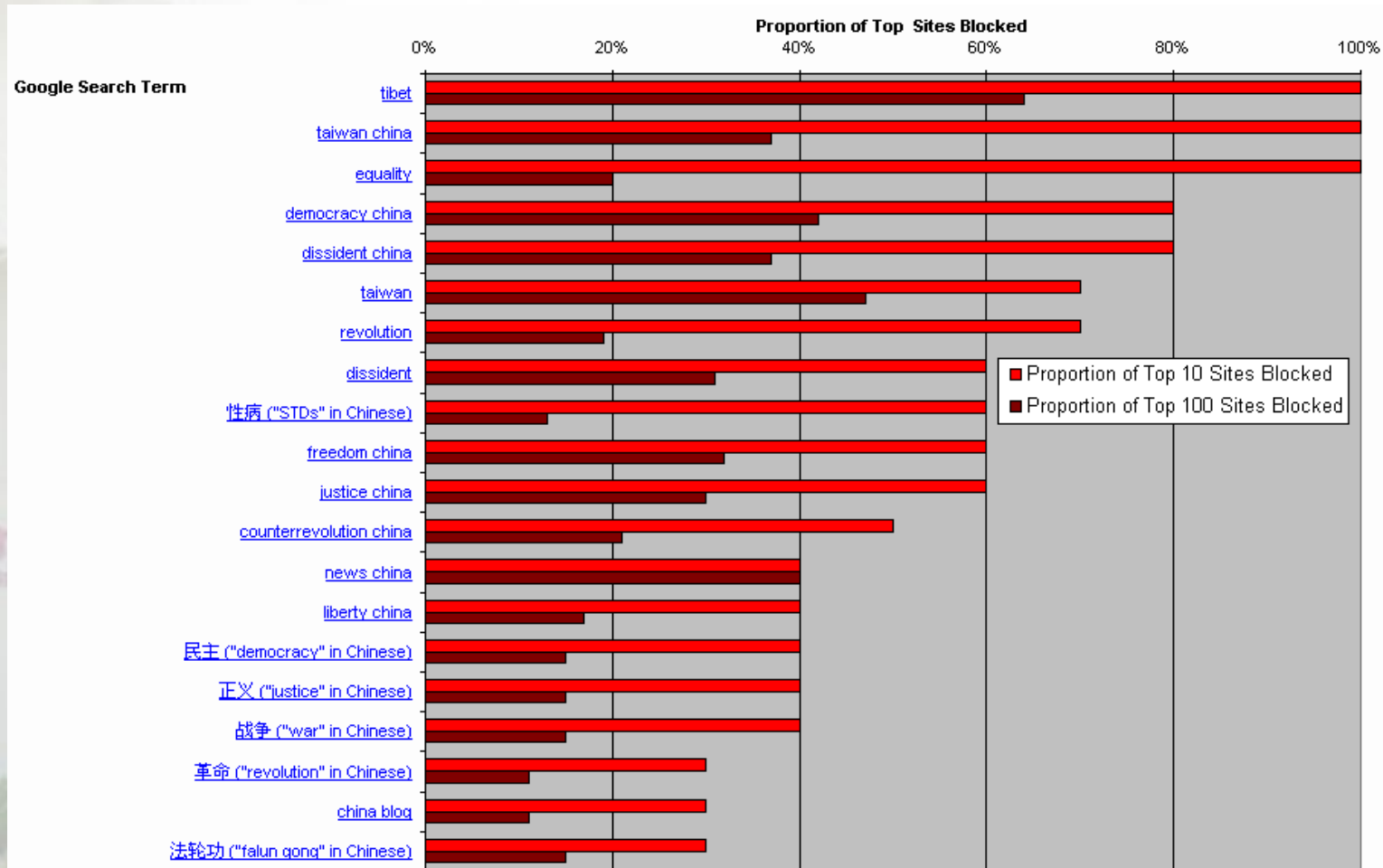

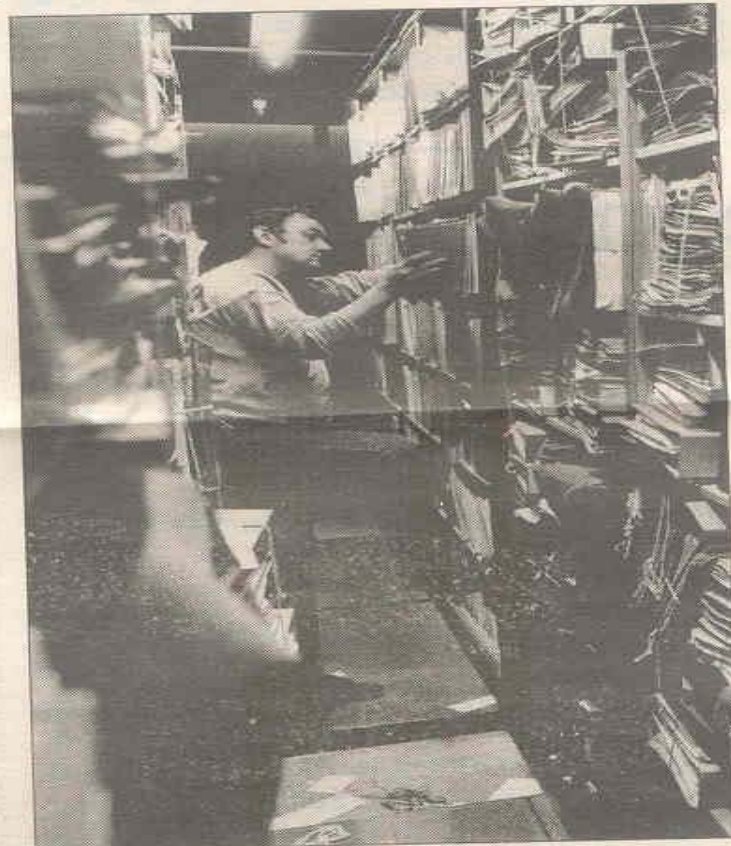
