







OF JEAN ALEXANDER & CHRISTIAN PEACOCK,

At KILMARNOCK, a few Days ago.

Edinburgh, Novr. 14, 1807.

Dear Friend.

Am forry I have nothing at prefent to inform thee of, that will either the gratification of thy benevolent mind. And, were it not that thou art qualified to extract good out of evil, and ty to deeds of darkness, I would not, either in verse or profe, relate a circum- natives of Ireland, and, I understand, ftance, which must harrow up up thy foul, freeze thy blood, and make thee against them, and every possible exershudder at the name of man! 

The perpetrators robbed the house of 15l in silver, bank notes to the amount of 50l. two silver watches, and three plain gold rings.
