


System-wide print book collection: ~32 million print books (2005)

An inquiry into the nature and causes of the wealth of nations by Adam Smith (Book)

1,098 editions published between 1761 and 2008 in 18 languages and held by 5,327 libraries worldwide

The classic eighteenth-century treatise on the principles of political economics.

The theory of moral sentiments by Adam Smith (Book)

177 editions published between 1759 and 2007 in 10 languages and held by 1,968 libraries worldwide

[Adam] Smith is often misrepresented as a calculating rationalist exposing the pursuit of self-interest in the marketplace, regardless of the human cost. This book, however, clearly demonstrates that in addition to the unfettered economic pursuits of individuals, Smith was just as interested, if not more so, in the capacity of people to bestow and to esteem benevolence. It may be prudent, says Smith, to follow self-interest in our economic lives in order to secure the basic necessities, but this is only the first step toward the much higher goal of living a morally virtuous life. 


