Legal deposit in Norway

- all published content from all media to The National Library

Legal Deposit Act of 1989

- All printed material
- Music (sheet and sound)
- Broadcasting (radio and TV)
- Film and video
- Photographs
- Digital documents
- The .no domain



Strategy for developing a Digital National Library for the 21. Century

- Developed and adopted 2004 to 2006
- To be relevant in the future we have to be on internett
- We will digitise the whole collection. Will take 15-30 years, depending on budgets.
- The digitising will be done in an industrial «conveyerbelt» manner, from A to Å without consideration
- Exeptions will be made if material is needed for specific reasons

Revised legal deposit act July 1 2017

Changes

- Legal deposit of both the published format and the digital production-/print-files
 - metadata from production included
- Broad harvesting of the .no domain
 - Limited open access to the net-archive
 - Specific rules to privacy protection

...amendments July 1 2018

- Access to legal deposit in digital format
 - Four licences to be shared by University and College faculty and students
 - Two Licences to be shared by Public Libraries

Scale: - Total population 5 300 000

- Faculty and students 300.000

- Public libraries 650

Research institution and language bank

- Since 2010 The National Library have had the role of being The Norwegian Language Bank
 - Supply academia and the industry with relevant language resources
 - Developing text corpuses and tools for quantitative text analysis - Digital Humanities
 - Since this year: colaborate with «the Industry» to secure the use of Norwegian Languages in digital assitants and the like

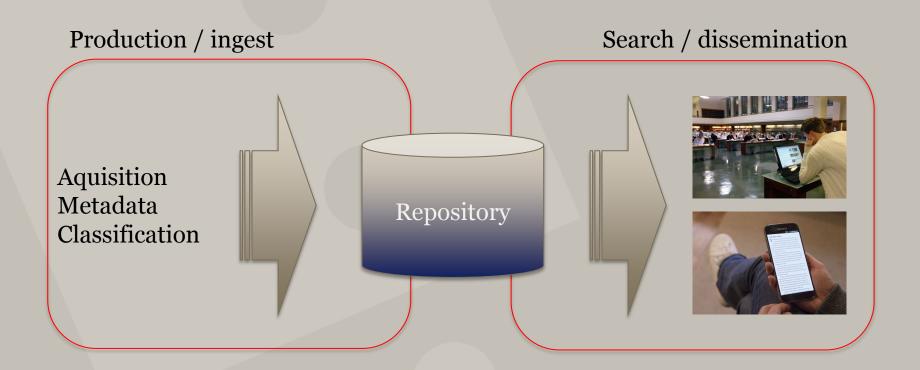

- Main tool Google TenzorFlow (open source software library)

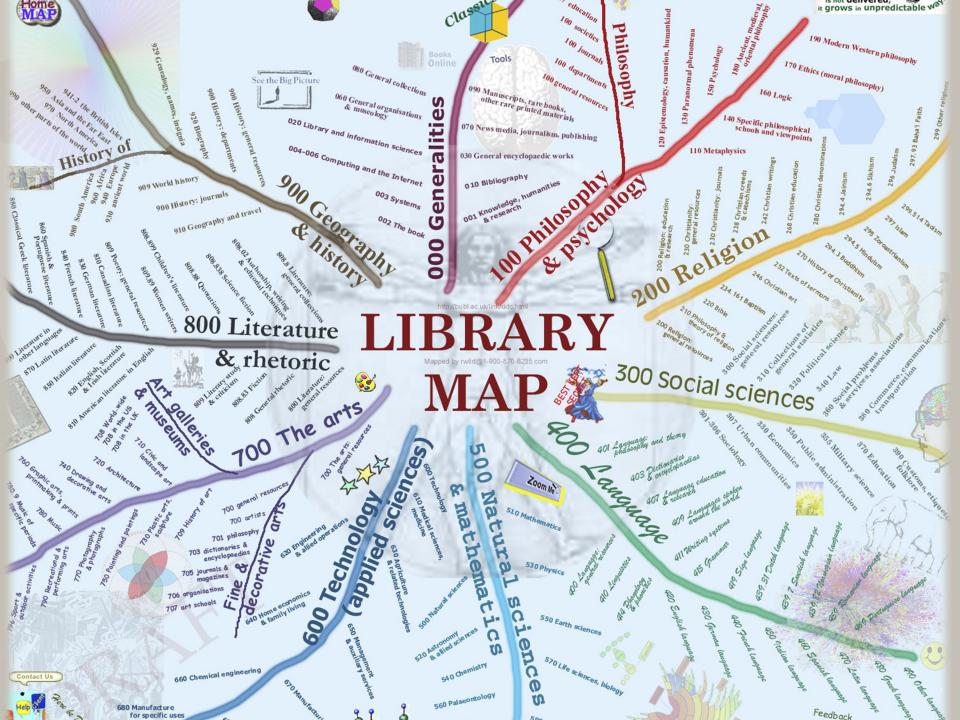
Two spheres for Al-testing

- Assign each books to only one group

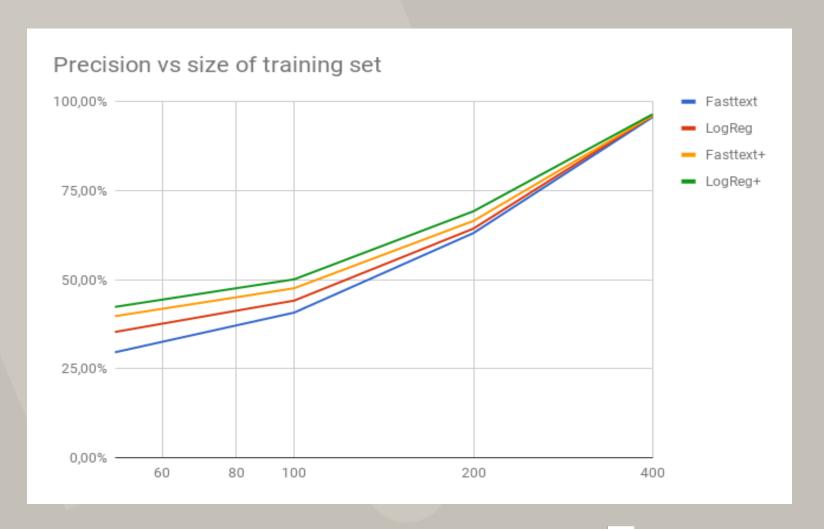
• Result: accuracy 95%

• The right to comment, conceal or delete personal information that is made available by mistake, or.....

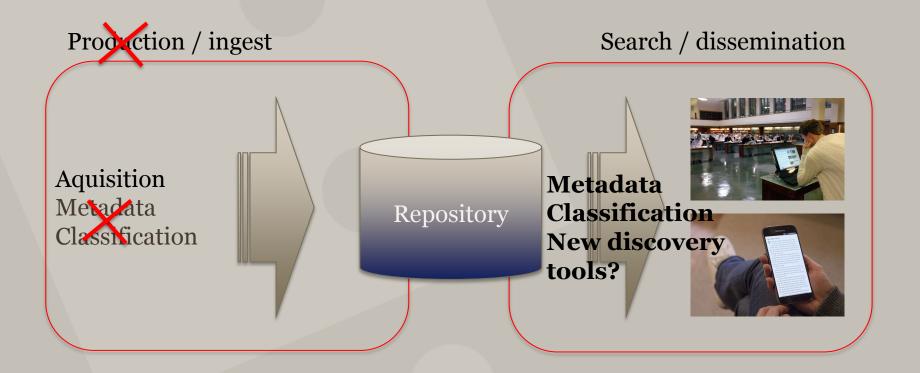
if published by a site without a responsible editor those concerned may demand the information to be concealed or deleted

 A request for deletion that is disputed by The National Library may be appealed to a separate board
