


Open Access - Gold

- Primarily monographs (some academic-trade crossover)
- PDF and HTML full-text online, now ePub, hardback print (paperback for trade)
- Mostly CC-BY-NC-ND licence, preferred in HSS over CC-BY
- BPC = £9,850 + VAT (up to 120,000 words + 20 illustrations)
- Full-service Rigorous peer review, editorial, production and marketing support












Example 2: The metamorphosis of Autism


- Medical history monograph

- Hardback sold £25








Example 3: Go Home?

- Spike in Autumn 2018, link to the Yellow Vest movement?










Downloads since launch

Where next?

- Certainty in the direction of travel
