

"The tower of the Winds is at present a chapel for the dance called *Sema*, which is performed in it every Friday... The dance which I saw performed here was at the same time the most horrid and the most ridiculous ceremony that can be imagined! It is extremely difficult for a spectator who has not been accustomed to such singular sights to remain serious; and it would have been dangerous to laugh at their religious ceremonies... The song and the motion of the dancers by degrees become more animated; on a sudden the company all start up, and sing and dance in a circle, with great violence and velocity! When they are tired, they make way for two principal performers, who, holding each other by the sash which is tied about the waist, turn round with an incredible rapidity, far exceeding anything I could have supposed the human frame capable of, and which would greatly surprise our most active dancers or posture masters... The faintings and groanings of the Derwisches who turn in this manner for two hours together without stopping, and that their vanity is gratified in the exercise of an occupation, to which we should give the name folly!"

The Gennadius Library has a rich, rare collection of travelers' books. Its founder, Joannes Gennadius, a passionate and knowledgeable collector, assembled a library that enlightens many aspects of Greek history and culture; he placed special importance and weight on the travelers' literature especially on their observation of alterity and particularly of the activities, habits, doctrines, laws and ties between the Greeks and other ethnic (national) groups that lived in the regions of the Ottoman Empire.

Through the eyes of the Other, European artists, collectors, antiquarians and diplomats, merchants, naturalists and clergy wrote down in their travelogue their quest and the ways in which they realized and accomplished the objectives of their missions and wanderings in the regions of Ottoman Empire; they recorded their experience and observations, but also the thoughts, which were generated when they looked at and came into contact with another world.




The experience borne from bridging a distance, often away from the native land, with intermediary stops and transitions to other destinations, the conquest of something different and the escape from what is known compose the traveling text in the form of letters to familiar persons, reports to collaborators and personal diaries. At a period when traveling was dangerous, the traveling text functioned in a multiplicity of ways. The traveler/ author was interested in transmitting and keeping memories and images of a distant world that was difficult to see again; the readers / recipients shared the traveling experience through their imagination, since for them traveling during that time was a practically unattainable enterprise or simply a dream.





TravelTrails

TravelTrails is an online database, which indexes, categorizes and analyzes travelers' accounts in the Eastern Mediterranean from the early sixteenth-century up to 1830. Based on the collections of the Gennadius Library and the Aikaterini Laskaridis Foundation, it helps the user to navigate through the diverse and rich historical information contained in travel literature.

The overall objective is to explore travelers' texts from various angles and perspectives, offering the user maximum information contained on a variety of themes, from architecture to everyday life, food to legal issues, politics to craftsmanship, etc. The information is arranged in broad thematic units subdivided into many subsections; excerpts can be retrieved by looking for a specific traveler/book, place, subject or keyword.

TravelTrails currently focuses on travelers' accounts of the sixteenth century. The entire body of literature up to 1830, with more than 10,000 entries, is still being processed, and it will be incorporated progressively.



This website hosts the results of the Research Programme ZEFYROS: Travel texts on Cyprus (15th-18th c.). The Programme was funded by the Sylvia Ioannou Foundation and conducted in 2016-2017 by 25 researchers in seven countries (Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Portugal, Sweden, The Czech Republic and The Netherlands), under the supervision of Julia Chatzipanagioti-Sangmeister, Professor of Modern Greek Literature at the University of Cyprus.

Within the framework of ZEFYROS, a multitude of information on the natural space, habitation, history and culture of Cyprus was indexed from, **125 editions of travel literature** from the **15th-18th centuries** in **11 languages** (Czech, Dutch, English, French, German, Greek, Italian, Latin, Portuguese, Spanish, Swedish).

These editions form part of the Sylvia Ioannou Foundation Collection.



THE E. J. FINOPOULOS COLLECTION

The E. J. Finopoulos Collection of history and travel books is one of the most important collections of its kind, not only in Greece but also worldwide. The acquisition of the material that comprises the collection, a lifetime endeavour on the part of the collector, started in 1963 with purchases from the burrows of book dealer George Jeffery in Farringdon Road, London. The greatest part of the collection was acquired abroad through second-hand dealers and auction houses. Due to the breadth and wealth of the collection many Greek and international researchers, of various disciplines, consult the collection regularly. The E. J. Finopoulos Collection was donated to the Benaki Museum on June 13, 2013 and operates, ever since, under the umbrella of the museum.

UNIQUENESS OF THE COLLECTION

A singular feature of the Collection is the acquisition of variations of the same title. Researchers can study different impressions, subsequent editions or translations in other languages of the same book. Comparative examination of the variations allows not only the accumulation of supplementary information but also allows the tracing of the history of a particular book, since alternate editions usually portray differences in textual and visual material.

The present Atlas accompanied the second edition of the book, which was published in 1841. We noted that the text of the aforementioned edition, which is not in the Collection, is identical to the text of 1828 which is held in the Collection. We noticed, however, minor differences concerning both editions. Mainly, that the copy of the first edition of 1828, includes a list of plates, while in the second edition this list is not necessary since the plates are in the Atlas.

Other differences between the two versions exist on the half-title, the title page, and the printer. More specifically in the 1841 edition, the verso of the half-title does not include the excerpt of Busbequius's letter in Latin and French, whereas this excerpt appeared in the edition of 1828. Moreover, in the 1828 edition the name of the printer, Belin, appears on the verso of the title page. In contrast, in the second edition, the printer is Paul Renouard, whose name appears on the verso of the half-title.

The present Atlas lacks plate IV "Carte nouvelle du Bosphore et de ses environs de Constantinople...", which has been replaced by a photocopy. Plates are numbered with Roman numerals from I-X and are the same in both the first and second edition.

Τυχαίνει κατόπιν συγκρίσεως να παρατηρήσουμε ότι οι δύο εκδόσεις διαφέρουν μεταξύ τους. Κυρίως για το γεγονός ότι το αντίτυπο της 1ης έκδοσης του 1828 που βρίσκεται στη Συλλογή περιλαμβάνει τους πίνακες μέσα στο κείμενο, ενώ στη 2η έκδοση του 1841 οι πίνακες βρίσκονται στον περιγραφόμενο Άτλαντα. Άλλες διαφορές μεταξύ των δύο εκδόσεων είναι ως προς το ψευδότιτλο, τη σελίδα τίτλου και τον τυπογράφο. Πιο αναλυτικά, στην έκδοση του 1841 στο verso του ψευδότιτλου δεν υπάρχει το απόστιασμα της επιστολής του Βusbequius στα λατινικά και τα γαλλικά, στοιχεία που υπάρχουν στην έκδοση του 1828. Εντούτοις, παρατηρούμε ότι στην 1η έκδοση του 1828 στο verso της σελίδας τίτλου αναφέρεται ο τυπογράφος Belin, ενώ στη 2η έκδοση ο τυπογράφος δεν είναι ο ίδιος, αλλά ο Paul Renouard, το όνομα του οποίου αναφέρεται στο verso του ψευδότιτλου. Στο συγκεκριμένο Άτλαντα λείπει ο πίνακας VI, ο οποίος έχει αντικατασταθεί από φωτοτυπία: "Carte nouvelle du Bosphore et de ses environs de Constantinople...". Οι πίνακες είναι αριθμημένοι με λατινική αρίθμηση από I-X και είναι ίδιοι τόσο στην πρώτη όσο και στη δεύτερη έκδοση.





Maps of The Mediterranean The Gennadius Library is a repository of an outstanding collection of about 3,000 historical maps on Greece, the Balkans and Turkey, which clearly occupied an important position in the collection of Joannes Gennadius. Spanning a period from the late fifteenth to the twentieth centuries, these maps are either drawn in hand or were printed by noted cartographers and map publishers. Among many important maps may be noted the series of island maps in the Ionian and Aegean seas from a fifteenth century manuscript of Buondelmonti's Liber Insularum (illustrated on this page), an early nineteenth century chart of the Aegean by Nicolas Kefalas (possibly the first printed Greek nautical chart), and



numerous maps concerned with the political development of the Balkan states in the late nineteenth century. Leonora Navari and Alexis Malliaris assembled and catalogued this valuable cartographic material under the wise leadership of Catherine DeG.

Vanderpool and Natalia Vogeikoff-Brogan (MedMaps project completed in 2004). The material was digitized in various phases first by photographers Arthur and Jennifer Stephens, and in 2011-2014 by the ESPA grant "Digital Access to the Gennadius Library." 

The digital map as well as the web application were reformed during the summer of 2021, upgrading the user interface, embedding additions and









Figure 1: Creating the Big Data of the Past (A) Current situation. (B) Extension based on digitisation and processing of new sources. (C) Extension based on simulation.
