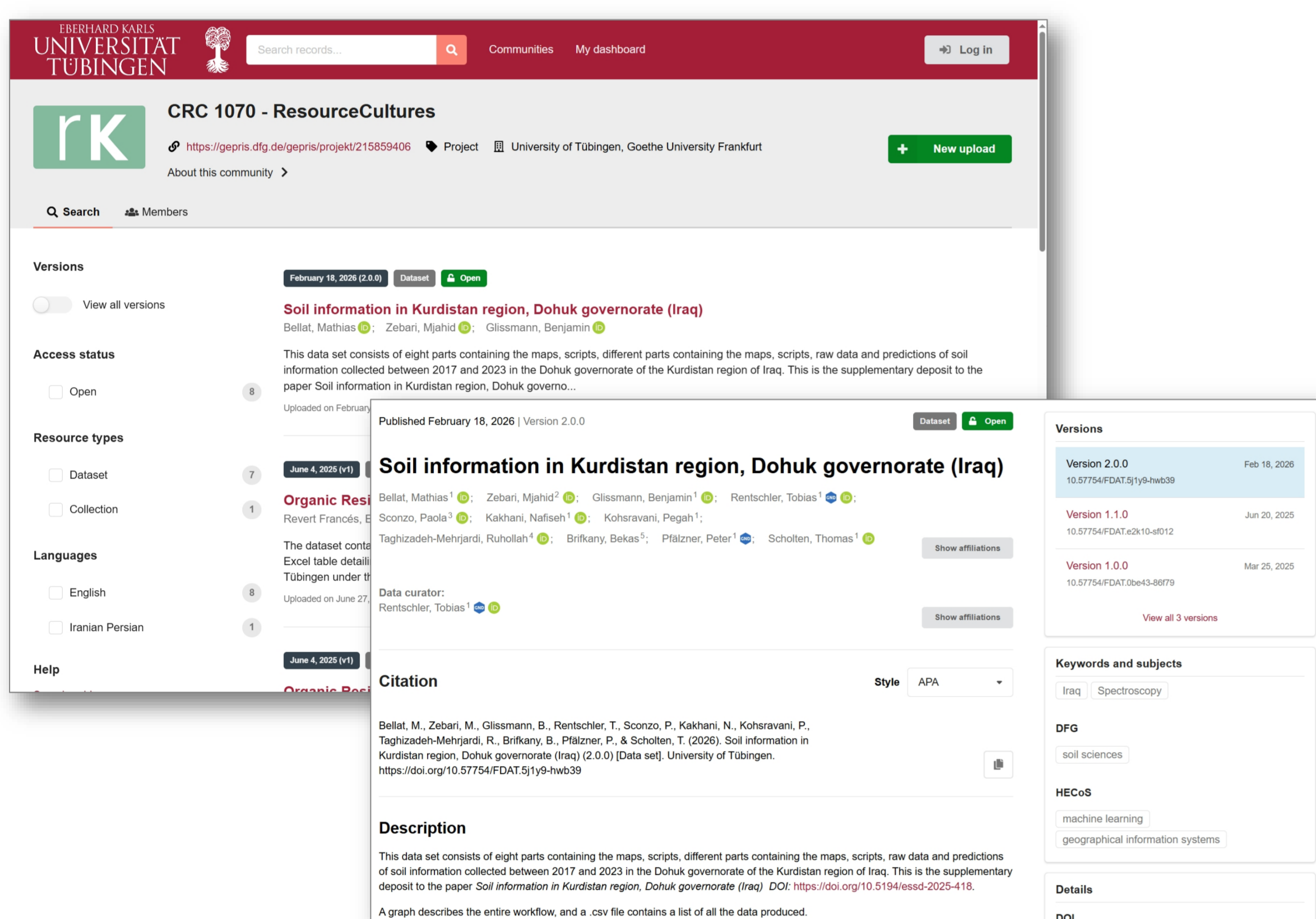




# The Role of the University of Tübingen's Digital Humanities Center in Promoting Access, Sustainability, and Digital Competencies

Digital Humanities Center (DHC) is the university's core facility for the humanities and social sciences, supporting sustainable research practices through digital infrastructure, data stewardship, and training

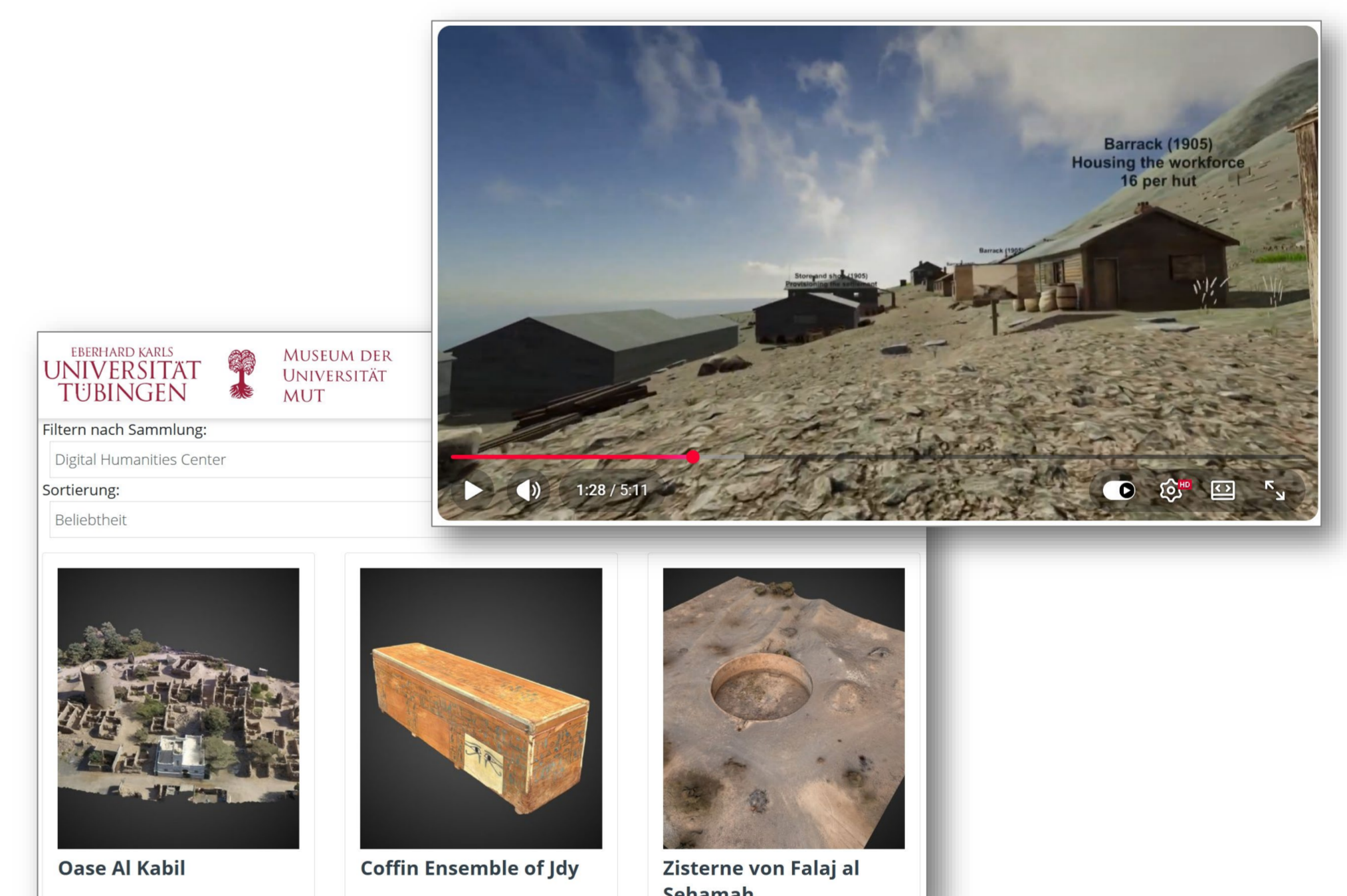


## Promoting FAIR Access to Research Data

- Cultivating a culture of responsible **data stewardship** guiding management and ethical sharing of data
